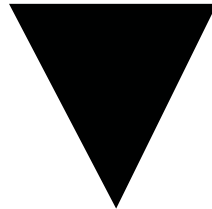



ONLY **4 IN 10** WOMEN
DIAGNOSED WITH OVARIAN
CANCER WILL HAVE
SURVIVED 5 YEARS FROM
DIAGNOSIS. THIS COMPARES
TO **9 IN 10** WOMEN
SURVIVING BREAST CANCER
IN THE SAME PERIOD.

THERE ARE **SEVEN** GYNAECOLOGICAL CANCERS
OVARIAN, UTERINE (OFTEN CALLED ENDOMETRIAL),
VULVAR, VAGINAL, CERVICAL AND TWO RARE
PREGNANCY CANCERS.

UTERINE (ENDOMETRIAL) CANCER
IS ONE OF THE FIVE MOST
COMMONLY DIAGNOSED CANCERS IN WOMEN.
